How do I know how I am doing?

Your course tutor will work with you to develop an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) which will help you and your tutor keep on track with how you are progressing on your course – as well as helping you to choose your next steps.

It is important that you talk to your tutor if you have any worries or if you think you need more help.

Wales Essential Skills Toolkit (WEST)

This is an online session that will help you to understand where you are up to with your literacy, numeracy and IT skills. Your tutor may suggest you do this so that in time you will now how far you have come in each of those areas. Talk to your tutor if this is something you would be interested in.



Qualifications

Some of the courses we offer will mean you get a qualification – these are called accredited courses.

Some will not mean you gain a qualification (these are called non accredited) but are as important as they will help build your confidence and you may then move on to a course that will give you a qualification.

Staying Safe (Safeguarding)

Safeguarding is the word we use to make sure everyone knows and understands how they and those around them can keep safe and know who to talk to if they have any concerns for themselves or others around them.

Safeguarding includes everything we can do to keep people safe, including preventing accidents, doing something about safety concerns and making sure people grow up and live safely.

Make sure you know who the Lead Provider is for the course you are following.

PREVENT – What is it?

PREVENT – is a shortened version of the words *Preventing Violent Extremism*.

PREVENT is all about stopping anyone from getting involved in extremism or terrorism and is there to support you and keep you safe.

Our tutors will take you through all of the things that PREVENT upholds and allows us all to live in a democratic country recognising and respecting the beliefs of others.

If you are worried about anything you hear or see on your course talk to your tutor or contact your lead provider (the person named in the safeguarding table).

Next steps - Progression

So what can you do when you have finished this course?

There will be many options for you once you have finished the course you are on but you can talk to your tutor about all of these things which will be in your ILP.

We will encourage and support you to continue your journey into gaining more skills and experiences and consider some things that you may never have thought about.

This could include gaining a formal qualification or having a go at new skills that you now have the confidence to try.

Careers Wales can also help you with your next steps by offering an appointment for you to meet a Careers Advisor. They have offices in Flintshire and Wrexham if you want to see them in person but also can help you over the phone or on a video call – if you need help with sorting out an appointment your tutor can help you to do this.
